Arctic Weather Brings <u>More</u> than Snow and Cold to Detroit

-- Alaska Airlines to initiate first-ever Detroit service -- New nonstop flight to Seattle begins September 4th

Detroit, MI (February 11, 2014) – Earlier today, Alaska Airlines announced it will begin serving the Motor City with its own iconic Eskimo-painted planes. The new daily service between Detroit Metropolitan Wayne County Airport (DTW) and Alaska's hub at Seattle Tacoma International Airport (SEA), SEA-TAC, marks the first time Alaska will operate scheduled passenger service to and from Detroit using their own aircraft.

"Alaska's decision to initiate new nonstop service between Seattle and Detroit shows the strength of our local business and leisure travel market," said Thomas Naughton CEO of the Wayne County Airport Authority (WCAA). "Many may not realize it, but Alaska Airlines served nearly 6,000 travelers through Detroit last year in conjunction with its alliance partnerships with Delta and American Airlines."

The new nonstop service will begin on September 4, 2014 with 737-900ER aircraft which seat 181 passengers. The daily flight from Seattle is scheduled to arrive at DTW's North Terminal at 4:14 pm, and depart Detroit at 5:20 pm for the return to SEA-TAC.

Seattle has a rich and diverse manufacturing and technology economy that shares much in common with Detroit and Michigan. Both are important port cities that serve as vital gateways to their surrounding regions.

"It makes good sense for Alaska to start landing their own planes here, and we welcome their new service" said Joe Cambron, Director of Air Service Development for Detroit Metro Airport. "Seattle is a key gateway to the Pacific Northwest, and the carrier's namesake state of Alaska. Government data shows that 32% of all passengers flying between Detroit and Alaska connect to an Alaska Airlines plane during their journey; this new service is going to make it much easier for travelers to reach many of those destinations." The new service announced by Alaska Airlines follows a great 2013 where Detroit saw new air service to Houston, TX and Denver, CO on Spirit Airlines; Trenton, NJ on Frontier Airlines and Ft. Myers on Southwest Airlines. 2014 will now see two brand new air carriers add service to DTW with JetBlue adding three daily flights to Boston in March and Alaska adding Seattle in September. Frontier Airlines will also add service to Wilmington (Philadelphia), DE in April 2014. "We've been on quite a streak lately with all these new low-cost carrier services and this year also brings our first ever second daily flight to London Heathrow starting in June on Delta," said Marcus Kemper, VP of Planning and Development. "We hope to keep up all the momentum going forward."
